SEXUAL VIOLENCE CARE



Neither the partner law firm nor ASEQ | Studentcare claim to hereby exactly and exhaustively define the notion of "sexual violence." The present definition is only given to circumscribe the offer of services within the framework of the Program.

Within the scope of Sexual Violence Care, the notion of sexual violence exhaustively includes the following behaviours:

- a) Sexual assault, i.e. a sexual action directed toward the victim without their consent, including attempts and/or threats;
- b) Blackmailing for sexual purposes, i.e. printing, copying, publishing, distributing, or circulating a visual recording of a sexual nature of the victim (photography and video) or threatening the victim with committing such an act in order to obtain a favour from them;
- c) Sexual extortion, i.e. repeatedly soliciting the victim in order to obtain sexual favours from them;
 - d) Exposure, i.e. exposing one's genital organs for sexual purposes;
- e) Sexual harassment, i.e. words, gestures, or actions of a sexual nature repeatedly directed toward the victim:
- f) Voyeurism, i.e. observing the victim for sexual purposes through any method, including mechanical or electronic methods, in such a way as to reasonably be considered an infringement of protection of privacy.
